WASHINTON, April 21.-It is freely admitted among the high officials of the American government today that a break with Germany is almost certain, and nothing short of a complete almost certain, and nothing short of a complete
compliance wit hthe demands made by the Unicompliance wit hthe demands made by the Uni-
ted States will avert the break.

The situation grew more serious today when the United States dispatched a second note to the Imperial Government demanding that submarine war fare against merchantmen stop immediately pending an understanding as to how Germany may carry on her submarine war fare in the future without endangering the relations with neutral powers.
The prediction is also made by administration officials today that a pass port will be handed the German Embassador Bernstorff as the result of further investigation in the bomb plot. "Bernstorff has been trapped," is the expression made after the receipt of a confession made by a German agent in New York.

The confession of Herst von der Goltz, a secret agent of the German government, who is now in the custody of the United States authorities in New York, names prominent German agents, and it is believed that Bernstorff is included in the list, and papers seized in the custody of Wolf von Igle substantiates the confession made by von der Goltz.
