





By United Prace WASHINGTON, July 10. - Congressman Caldwell, of New York, introduced a resolution in the House this morning asking for the appointment of a commission composed of five members, including one senator and one congressman, to negotiate with Mexico for the purchase of Lower California, and the northern Mexican states. The resolution carries with it an appropriation of twenty thousand dollars for the purpose of carrying on the work. The Mexican government has been called on to name a similar commission. The resolution provides that the commission begin its work at the ear-

liest possible time, and be ready to make its report at the opening of the next session of congress. It is believed by many congressmen that the bill will pass the House.
