## Annual Spring Pecan Field Day Planned For May 16 At Ranger

Oscar Schaefer, Route 2, Cisco, president of the Eastland County Pecan Growers Association, has announced that the Association will hold its annual Spring Field Day in Ranger on Friday, May 16.

The discussions will cover marketing, spraying, latest techniques of grafting, etc., and each subject will be discussed by an expert which will include Don King, of the Department of Entomology at A & M College; Joe Orchard of Texarkana, grower and director of the State association; L. C. Romberg of the Brownwood U. S. Field Stations and others.

The meeting will convene at 10 a. m. at the Ranger College cafeteria and will continue through noon, and the group will then go to a joint meeting of the Ranger Lions and Rotary Clubs, also in the cafeteria.

After the luncheon members of the association and those interested will go on a field trip to B. B. Freeman's orchard, about 10 miles south of Ranger where they will be shown the latest techniques of grafting, check the orchard for smut damage and the pecan nut case bearer, and also

for this insect's eggs. A unique feature of the trip to the Freeman orchard will be a demonstration of spraying by helicopter by John L. Scott, of the Continental Copters, Inc. of Fort Worth, a new method of spraying in this section.

Pecan growers from adjoining counties are cordially invited to attend. The Eastland County Pecan Growers Association was organized in December, 1956, as a result of the efforts of County Agent J. M. Cooper who, since 1946, has waged a campaign of development and improvement of the pecan industry in this county. The association will hold its annual tours in the Fall and the staging of the annual pecan show in December of each year. There were over 250 entries in last year's show, held in Cisco.

Officers of the association are Oscar Schaefer, president; Ellis Cooper, Ranger, vice president; and B. B. Freeman of Ranger secretary-treasurer.

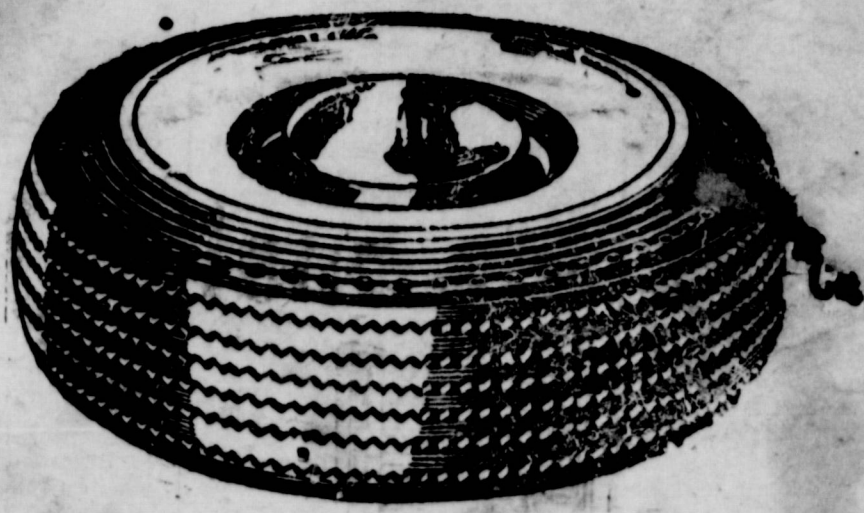

## Soil Stewardship Week Is Set For Observance May 11 To 18

The week May 11-18 will be observed nationally as Soil Stewardship Week and churches of Eastland County have been furnished details of the annual event, it was reported today by E. E. McAlister of the Upper Leon Soil Conservation Service.

Donald A. Williams, administrator of the U. S. Soil Conservation Service, has issued a statement pointing out "the growing observance of National Soil Stewardship Week by both individuals and groups indicates not only a feeling of kinship to the soil but society's growing recognition of its dependence on soil and water resources."

The event is sponsored by the National Association of Soil Conservation District and national church organizations. The scope of this year's observance is expected to exceed the participation of a year ago, judging from reports of district and church leaders, Mr. Williams said.

"Throughout the ages the sun, the soil and the rain have held an honored place in man's beliefs," Mr. Williams said. "His dependence on the soil for his very life gives man's use of this life-supporting resource a deep spiritual significance. It is appropriate that the clergy and churches join with farmers and soil conservation districts in emphasizing to all of us the importance of each doing a good job of stewardship."

"God provided the productive soil and the rain and the sun to care for our materials needs. As stewards or husbandmen of the soil we honor God and preserve His earliest creation. We also hold in our hands our own welfare and that of coming generations."
