TRACTOR SHOW WAS BIG DEMONSTRATION FARMERS OF THIS SECTION ORGANIZE

Declaring that the national tractor demonstration which closed in Dallas Thursday afternoon to be one of the greatest educational movements ever undertaken for the benefit of the farming public, J. McGregor returned today from Dallas loud in praise of the big exhibition. Mr. McGregor was accompanied home by G. W. and F. E. Clayton, two Runnels county farmers, who took advantage of the opportunity to visit Dallas during the demonstration. O. R. Sims of Paint Rock, also arrived home on the same train. "No day during the demonstration," said Mr. McGregor, "was there less than 10,000 people attending the big show. On some days there were as many as 20,000 people witnessing the demonstration. There is no doubt in my mind that the affair is the greatest of its kind ever undertaken for the benefit of the farmers of Texas. They came from every part of Texas and they returned home as I did, loud in praise of the exhibition."

Mr. McGregor said there were tractors of every design and make on exhibition. The only matter left for solution in the minds of the visitors was which of the tractors he liked best. It was proven, Mr. McGregor said, that the tractor has a place in farming and a valuable place, too. The Dallas demonstration is one of five being given in the southwest, the first having been held in Oklahoma. The second was at Dallas, and third will be held in Dallas next week.

A district organization which Central West Texas will have the same end in view that the Texas Farmers' Institute has for all of Texas was organized at Austin this week, and C. A. Doose of Ballinger was elected president. Mr. Doose, along with about fourteen others interested in better agriculture, returned Thursday from Austin where he attended the annual meeting of the state farmers institute.

The new organization is represented in an official capacity by two Runnels county men. Besides Mr. Doose, who is president, Secretary Hunton of Miles, is cognizant of the value such an association will have in this part of the state.

The organization was perfected because of the fact that the needs of a North Texas farmer do not coincide with those of a farmer in Central West Texas, nor can the principles of farming such as used in East Texas be applied in Central West Texas. Accordingly the farmers of sixteen counties in this part of the state, realizing the importance of holding an annual institute of their own and discussing such problems as come before them and matters for the promotion of agriculture in general, perfected the Central West Texas farmers institute.

The appointment of two Runnels county men as officers of the new organization is considered an honor and a recognition of the importance of Runnels county as a farming center. Mr. Doose is understood to have strongly encouraged the organization and was one of the advocates of an institute which would suit the direct needs of farmers operating in the semi-arid section of Texas.

The new district is the first of its kind in the state and will be watched by other sections of the state. In the event the Central Texas body proves beneficial, then similar organizations will be organized in East, North and Central Texas, for to a large extent it is stated, each of these districts have difficulties of their own and no set rule of farming will apply to all of them. Although the Central West Texas institute is an experiment in a way. Mr. Doose, backed by the farmers of the sixteen counties, believe that it is a permanent affair and one which will be a pace-setter to the other sections of the state.

Abilene is said to be almost the geographical center of the new district.

The first institute meeting will be held in Abilene during the last week in August, the exact date to be determined by the president and executive committee. This latter committee will be made up of one delegate from each county in the district. Each delegate to the meeting Wednesday pledged a delegation from his county to the Abilene meeting. It is planned to hold institutes at least four times each year at different places in the district.
