



mies have made public their plans. Independent soundings by Austria and Bulgaria, even if entirely tentative, have attracted interest here, however, as showing the dissatisfaction of those two governments with the course of the war and their apparent anxiety to negotiate directly and not through the medium of Germany to a more moderate stand are reported to be more eager for peace than their more powerful ally, a degree of hope is felt that their exigencies may force Germany to a more mederate stand and bring the day of ultimate peace nearer.
