# MAY CLOSE BREWERIES UNTIL WAR HAS ENDED

WASHINGTON, April 14. — America's big push for food may wipe out the breweries and the dis-

paring to launch a spectacular drive on this proposition. They propose to stop the manufacture of all intoxicating liquors and beers in this country at least for the period of the great war.

Beer and whiskey manufacture is diverting millions of bushels of grain from food channels, say the supporters of the measure.

The move is aimed with such mo mentum that the brewers have made overtures to restrict their output and release fifteen million bushels of grain for food. "Dry" advocates, however, scorned the offer made by the beer makers.






