Peruvian Government Nips Naval Revolt in the Bud.

Lima, Peru, April 18.—Charges that a number of important officers were implicated in a plot for a naval revolt are under investigation by the Peruvian government today.

The conspiracy is said to have been hatched in retaliation for the arrest of certain naval commanders. The ministry of marine gained an inkling of the situation and promptly dismantled the guns on the warships besides disabling the vessels' engines by removing es sential parts of each which were locked up in the arsenal under heavy guard.
