

In Nebraska the condition of the crop is only 35 per cent of normal; in Kansas, 45 per cent. Taking the country as a whole, the promised yield is 25 per cent lower than the average for the last ten years. The government report indicates 50,000,000 bushel loss from last rear, and 240,000,000 bushels less than 1915.

In 1915 the country produced 670,00 tons of cabbage; last year the yield was 247,000 tons. The potato crop fell from 360,000,000 bushels to 285,000,000. 


