LONDON, May 25 .- "We dealt more effective blows at the German submarine menace during the past three weeks than during any corresponding period," declared Premier Lloyd-George in the house of commons today. Continuing, the premier said, "our losses in ships for May will probably be under the total loss for April. We are making satisfactory progress, and we can congratulate ourselves on an expectedly early improvement in dealing with the submarine menace. If everybody economizes and all available land is used to the production of food the submarines will not defeat

sentee. The absentee should mail will reach that official by Registration Day. A self-addressed stamped envelope should be enclosed with the card to insure the return to the absentee of a regis tration certificate.

7. Registration booths will be open from 7 a. m. to 9 p. m. or Registration Day, June 5, 1917.




