# Tornado Sweeps Four States Last Night; Score Are Dead

KANSAS CITY, Mo. June 2 .-At least twenty are known to be BARNUM & BAILEY dead, and scores are injured in the path of a tornado in Eastern Kansas, Western Missouri, and parts of Oklahoma and Arkansas last night.

Eleven persons are dead at Colgate, Oklahoma; five are dead at Drake, Okla.; three at Olathe. Kansas; one at Bartlelsville, Oklahoma; two are reported dead at McCune, Kansas, and one at Montana, Kansas.

It seems that a number of Mexcans and negroes of the registration age are still in the dark over the provisions made for their registration. A Ledger reporter asked a couple of Mexican this morning if they were going to register on June 5th. Both plead ignorance of the law, and one of the pair has already reached the age of 21. Mr. Perkins stated that no attempt would be made to force men to register on the 5th, but that they would be arrested later if they did not comply.
