Gets Billion Dollars More Than Asked For

PRISONERS TAKEN BY BRITISH TOTAL 76,000 IN CHICAGO

LONDON, June 15.—Since the GEN. HAIG tured seventy-six thousand prisoners, and since July 1916 has retaken 600 square miles of territory from the enemy.

The British have also taken on the Western front alone 434 big guns, according to estimates read in the house of commons this afternoon by J. I. McPherson.
