

Completion of FM 3101 tween US E0 in Eastland and US 183 north of Cisco has been sel as part of the 1968 Texas Farm to Market Road Pro-gram, the Texas Highway resident engineer, who will be in charge of the work, said that 5.4 miles will be built to finish the road. The first two miles have been completed . The new road will cross Lake Eastland and go toward Yellow Mound, intersecting US 183 north of Cisco.

The contract has not been let and no starting date has been set. Work is expected to run some 150 days from start-ing date. The road will include a new bridge across Lake Eastland. District Engineer E.M. Prit-

chard of Brownwood said the estimated cost of the work is \$64,000 and includes only the grading and structures.






