Abilene, Aug. 4.—The case of fifty-four West Texans indicted upon charges of conspiracy in connection with the anti-conscrip tion move, will be called at Abilene on Sept. 5th. All the men have been arrested, some are out on bond while others are being sheld in jail. The editor of the Rebel, the socialist paper, is a mong the number to be tried. Judge Higgins, of Snyder, has been employed to defend the men. Judge George W. Jack, federal judge of the Shreveport district, will preside at the special term of the court called for the trial of the cases. It is reported that the indicted men will ask for a change of venue, and it is probable the cases will be transferred to some other federal court.


