## County's Surplus Food Program To Be Working Soon

County Judge John Hart announced last week that the county would soon begin distributing surplus food commodities to those eligible in Eastland County under the program recently set up and he also revealed that application blanks for the program are being distributed for the Carbon area at Collins Insurance office.

Judge Hart also again assured those who participate in the program that their assistant checks from the State or Federal governments will not be affected in any manner if they accept the food.

Under the program such surplus foods as butter, cheese, non fat dry milk, lard and shortening, dry beans, rice, cornmeal and flour would be available twice monthly.

The ground floor of the Masonic Lodge building in Eastland has been leased by the county for storage and J. J. Porter of Cisco has been hired by the county to oversee the program.

Judge Hart estimates that some 3000 citizens of the county will be eligible to participate under the program. He pointed out that residence in the county shall be a requirement. A person making less than \$60 monthly is eligible to participate. Two or three people with an income less than \$120 are eligible and on four or five people with an income of less than \$140 can participate. All recipients of old age assistance, aid to the blind and aid to dependent children are eligible.

growers he had aphids on his vines this year. He used Isotox and Malathion. There is more and more evidence that the aphids are developing an immunity to the insecticides.

The club emblem is a four leaf clover with a letter "H" in each leaflet. The 4 H's stand for head, heart, hands and health.

The Eastland County Pecan Growers Association was organized last December in Cisco, according to County Agricultural Agent J. M. Cooper who, along with Schaefer, assisted the tour committee composed of Conrad Schaefer, Doss Alexander and W. D. Thurman in planning the all day affair.

After lunch at a Rising Star cafe the group will check the nuts in the irrigated orchard of C. E. Smith, near the outskirts of that city. Afterwards they will inspect the orchards of C. T. Barton, Doss Alexander and Ike Plumlee, all near Pioneer.

The plans and the place for the annual pecan show will likely be discussed sometime during the day, perhaps during the lunch hour, Schaefer said.

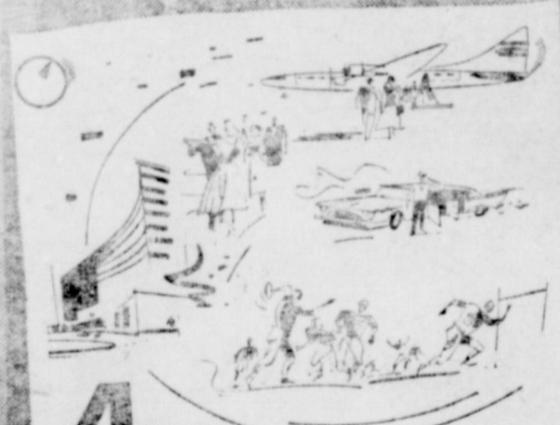

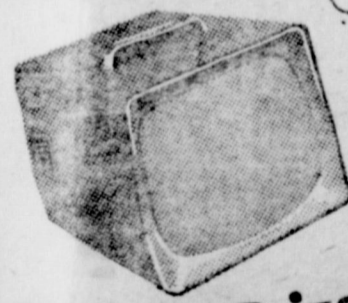

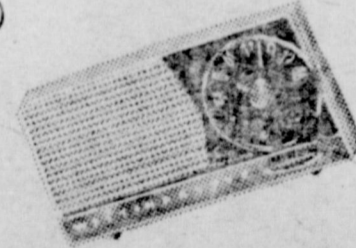
