





The boys all have to take a bath every day and keep themselves clean, their shoes shined, their clothes cleaned, clean their finger nails and wash their teeth three times a day and if the officer finds them dirty he makes them clean up. The inspectors come around twice each week and looks the camp over, and the soldiers must clean up around the tents every morning. If that isn't elean, what is it? Those who have been in the army since war was declared know that I am telling the truth, and there is not any man on the outside cleaner than a soldier or soil-


