





"The signatures of only 250 qual ified voters of the county are necessary to make the calling of an elcetion mandatory upon the part of the county commissioners. The law on the subject states that the commissioners' court may call a local option election whenever it deems it expedient, without the receipt of a petition. An election must be ordered, however, when petition signed by 250 qualified voters is presented. The court must set a date for the election during the term in which it receives the petition. The election can be called in not less than fifteen days, but must be ordered before the expiration of thirty days.

"It was stated Wednesday that the pros had not yet decided upor any certain date upon which they will request the calling of an election, although it was rumored that October 29, the day before the opening of the fall race meeting

"Tom Green county's last loca option election was held in March, 1915, the antis winning by a maority of thirty-seven votes. In an election two or three years previ ous, prohibition was defeated by a majority of about fifty-four.'
