Camp Travis, Texas, Nov. 19

To The Ballinger Ledger: As I have been appointed by my captain to represent the boys of Runnels county that is in my company, will write a few lines this evening. Don't know of but two boys in my company from Runnels county. Their names are Sam Baheringer of Ballinger and Sam Farmer of Miles. Many of the boys in the U. S. A. have gone to the front or to training camps. Have found our lives crowded full of new excitements, new interests, new diversion. But I am quite sure that many of the homes that they have gone from are rather empty because of their going. Lives they have left behind are shrinks strangely with the outgoing of her son.
