We left Norfolk on Friday, Sep. two days and when we got to the tional Defense. channel we were met by English orpedo boats.

Wednesday morning, Oct. 10 part of our boats went to Brest, France, convoyed by our torpedo boats; while the English convoyed us and the remainder of the ships up the channel.

That day, just as the sun went down, a British crusier was torpedoed about 300 yds off our starboard bow. It was hit with two torpedoes and sank in seven minites. Fifty one men and seven of ficers went down with it.

Well, just before the ship sank mother submarine came up between us and the sinking ship. The periscope was up about 30 seconds and went down when we saw it. 
