

SELECT SEED NOW; FAMINE PREDICTED

Fearing that there will be carcity of seed of all kind for the next planting season the department of agriculture is urging the armers to select their seed now and preserve them.


In a bulletin just sent out by the lepartment, the farmers are givn the following timely hint:

The seed that you plant in the cround plays a very important part in the crop that you harvest. ant faulty seed and you get a oor stand with weak vitality. Hence, it is well for every farmer o get good seed for his crop next

Good seed were scarce last season and many people had to use hat they would not have used otherwise. If this has not been carefully selected, you should be rather cautious about planting eed taken from these crops. It may be faulty and best results may not come from it. There may e some person whonf you know has the kind that you like and it is well bred-up. It that case go to him right now and contract for your seed.

An excellent plan for you to pursue is to decide upon the varety that you want to grow. Figare out how much seed you must have. It may be that you have our own seed. If it has been carefully selected, use it. If not, then set out to find it. If you do not know of any one who has what you desire, write to your county igent and get him to help you.
