London, Dec. 20. - Premier Lloyd George addressed the house of commons this afternoon and desecurity for future peace," said the premier, "and such peace should be achieved by the destruction of Germany's military power and the democratization of the German government. . We will continue to fight for the restoration and compensation for all invaded territories. . We are willing for the return of German colonies to be determined by an international peace conference, but to be decided in the end by the wishes of the people in such colonies for themselves. Mesopotamia and Armenia should never be returned to German rule and we will hold out for this with our allies.'


