





An ordinance governing the disposition of dead animals, having the same removed to the city rangements to help refugee familied dumping grounds, regulating fees to be charged by City for burying same and providing penalties for violations of same.

Be it ordained by the city commission of the city of Ballinger,

Sec. 1. Every person, firm, corperation, or association of persons, owning or controling any horses, cattle, mules, sheep, goats, hogs, dogs, jacks, jennets or other animals and, same should die within the limits of said city of Ballinger, shall immediately re-Queen in her work for the children move or cause to be removed said and is assisting in the support of hos- dead animal to the city dumping grounds, as provided and designated by ordinance.

Sec. 2. Every person, firm, corporation or association of persons shall pay the said city of Ballinger for services for burying said dead animal on said dumping horse, mule, jack, jennett, hog,

Sec. 3. Any person, firm, corporation and manager thereof or association of persons, who shall fail or refuse, immediately to remove or cause to be removed any dead animal, enumerated in section One of this ordinance, owned or controlled by him, it or them, and who shall fail or refuse immediately to pay or cause to be paid the said fee of \$1.00 to the
