The Brown-Mills Soil Conservation District bought 100 lbs: of Blackwell switchgrass seed from Guyle Greynolds this week. The seed will be turned over to the Soil Conservation Service and used to sow emergency spillways and dams of the flood prevention structures constructed in the Clear Creek Watershed of Brown

Creynolds produced the grass seed last year on his farm 3 miles south of Rising Star. He expects to harvest 3,000 lbs. of the grass seed this year. He planted 10 acres of the switchgrass in April, 1956.

A. M. Goss, conservationist on the local SCS staff, has returned from a threeweek training course held at Tarleton State College. According to Goss, all subjects relating to the conservation of soil and water were covered.
