MINUTE SPEAKER. With Americans, July 20-2 P. Judge A. K. Doss is slater for M. Bitter fighting is under way Aberican forces. Some towns have changed hands two and three times, counter attacks from each side causing the opposing armies to retreat and advance.

The Americans and French have advanced in the Marne region, throwing the boches back toward the river. Just south of the Marne the Franco-American forces advanced three and one quarter

London, July 20.- The Franco-American forces, after repulsing violent counter attacks by the Germans on the whole front from Soissons to Chateau-Thierry, rushed forward again today and are still progressing, it is learned here through authorative sources this afternoon. The prisoners counted on this sector alone total 18,800.

Paris, July 20.-The French and Americans continue to advance on a greater part of the offensive front between Aisne and the Marne, the French war office officially reports. The important town of Neiully St. Front has been captured. South of the Marne the allied troops hurled the Germans back on a fifteen mile front between Neuilly and Fossy and gained more ground towards the river.
