DRILLING RESUMED IN TWO OIL WELL

The big walking beams at the Russell oil well and at the Rowena oil well have been hooked on the cable which controls the drill, and drilling is underway again in both of these wells, after a delay of three or four days.

The open hole in the Russell well has been eased and the drilling resumed in that well Thursday afternoon, the bit going down to the bottom of the hole after the cave in had been cleaned out.

From time to time oil and gas continues to gush from this well, but the pressure is not so strong as it was Thursday morning when a shower of oil shot twenty feet above the derrick.
