Louis Raemaekers, the famous W. T. Crockett returned Friday out by the war," was unheard of before the war began. On August 1, 1914, he was living quietly with his of his native Holland. Four days later the City Hall. he drew the first cartoon, "Christen- 7 10 td. dom After Twenty Centuries," of a series that was to reveal him as a champion of civilization and make his name a household word in every country. Raemaekers personally investigated the Belgian horror, and though a hundred of his early cartoons bear witness to the burning impression made upon his mind, he has only once brought himself to speak publicly of this experience. It was at a dinner given the artist at the Savage club, London, and, pointing to the portraits of Peary, Shott, Nansen and Shackleton. Raemaekers sald: "L too, have been an explorer, gentlemen. I have explored a hell, and it was terror unspeakable." Raemaekers is in his forty-eighth year.




