That our boys are acquitting themselves in glorious fashion has been firmly estblished in the minds of the military men of the country. I hesitate about writing you what I would tell you face to face on account of the censorship rules. We try to abide by them, you know, but it is not improper to give you an insight into what the Americans have done during the last few weeks.

Our aviators too can pace around in the air with fiery torches. This afternoon one of the German aviators was brought down near these head quarters. The Americans who were pursuing him simply landed alongside the German machine and forced the enemy to surrender.
