THE HAGUE, NOV. 9 .- UNCONFIRMED REPORTS RE CEIVED HERE THIS MORNING STATE THAT INSURGENTS HAVE SEIZED BERLIN, SETTING FIRE TO THE POST OFFICE BUILDING.

London, Nov. 9.—Practically all of Germany is reported to be seething with revolt. Dispatches received here indicate that the important cities in all parts of the empire are in the hands of the revolutionists. Berlin, Dresden and many other cities are reported to have been seized by the revolutionists, who are fighting for the over throw of the kaiser and the warlords.





From one man to another he will go, passing a cup full of hot coffee to hands that tremble with the cold; bringing the comfort of a bit of sweet and a smoke.


Men will hail him cheerily, slapping im on the back; and when he has gone things will be a little easier in that trench because he has passed that way.
