and placing this city on a twentyfour hour mail and passenger service is responsible for general com plaint throughout the country Not only does the new schedule greatly cripple business by mail, delay, but people in the rural disthis list. Phone C. R. Crews or triet who have been receiving The Ledger office. daily mail, now receive their mail twenty-four hours later.

The passenger service is very unsatisfactory. Under the new rule of short milage which becomes effective on December 1st, north bound passengers will be required to change ears at Brownwood, both going and coming. This will make such travel subject to missing connections and cause a lay over of twenty-four hours in Brownwood. To make plain, let us say that if you are in Fort Worth and wish to come to Ballinger, you will be required to come over the Frisco to Brownwood, or pay the extra railroad fare for going by Temple, and if the Frisco is late and you miss the Santa Fe at Brownwood, you must remain in that city until the next Santa Fe daily train west which will cause a lay over of only twenty-four hours.

Under the present schedule the Santa Fe and A. & S. trains both arrive here at noon, giving us only one mail service daily, and the Santa Fe arrives here ten minutes ahead of the A. & S. causing west bound passenger coming in here over the A. & S. to lay over here 24 hours when a fifteen minute move up for the A. & S. or a fifteen minute late schedule for the Santa Fe would give direct

from the fruit pulp and juices that ave been sterilized and canned or bottled without sugar.

Can sugar substitutes be used in canning? Yes. Corn sryups and other table syrups not made from granulated sugar can be used with sugar. In some parts of the country suitable varieties of canned syrups and sor thums are available for preserving without adding any sugar.

How else may fruits be saved without the use of sugar? Some fruits may be dried; others may be stored in cool cellar. Fruit pulp may be evaprated to a paste, thus concentrating he natural fruit sugar


