> The West Texas Chamber of Com merce will be incorporated under the laws of Texas at once. Its purpose, as announced in the by-laws which were adopted, will be to foster, promote and develop the agricultural, livestock, mineral, manufacturing, commercial and other resources of West

There should be some medium for the expression of the conmon judgment of the people on these vital matters and they should not be left to chance or to the un tried judgment of inexperienced per ions. Organized effort is necessary

for the common good, There is a most pressing need for t campaign for the conservation of flood waters in order that excessive rainfall may be utilized for the production of crops. At the present ime there is scattered activity along this line but no more general concerted movement exists. There is no more important question than this and it is a problem in which all West Texas is vitally concerned. Conservation of rainfall is the greatest single need of Texas today.

"One of the first tasks this organ ization should undertake should be to encourage the full development of our vast petroleum deposits. There will arise in all probability occasions where concerted action on the part of the business men of West Texas will be necessary to protect and de fend this vast industry and certainly some central organized body should voice the judgment of the people. "Another matter which is not en

tirely foreign to the general purpose of this organization is that when there are problems that should be called to the attention of our state and federal governments they would be received more seriously if presented by a non-political organization representing all the combined laterests of West Texas This feature alone manifests the pressing seed for a central organization, and with such a medium West Texas would become a potent power in shaping the destinies of this great


