120,000 MULES AND HORSES FOR SALE

The auction sale of government mules and horses began at Fort Worth last Tuesday when 950 mules and 350 horses owned by the American government and 600! mules owned by the British govvernment were anctioned off at Camp Bowie.

The government will hold other auction sales until a total of 12, 000 mules and horses are disposed of. Sales will be held at Waco, San Antonio, and Houston army camps in the near future.

These mules and horses represent purchases made for the American army and which had not been shipped over seas when the war closed. They are being given an honorable discharge along with thousands of soldiers, and will be returned to the farm in better shape than when turned over to the government, and no doubt at a big loss in price to the govern-
