OIL WELL COMPLETED

Bennett and Little of Putnam have completed their No. 4 W. P. Ledbetter in the Scranton Field in southwest Eastland County. Location is in Section 4, M. Cherry Survey. The well had a daily potential of 25.6 barrels on pump from open hole at 1,720-1,735 feet.

Soil Conservation Activities Are Reported For This Region

Farmers and ranchers of this area continue to apply conservation practices to their lands at a most favorable rate. Terrace construction on cropland is the number one goal of many landowners at this time. Based on the capability of the land as determined by depth of the top soil, the slope of the field and the amount of erosion that has already taken place, some 1500 miles of terraces are needed in this area. The purpose of terraces is twofold — to hold maximum rainfall on the land where it falls and to conduct excessive run off water to protected outlets with least possible erosion.

Soil Conservation Service Technicians of the local work unit assisting the soil conservation district's supervision work with landowners in laying out a terrace system for their fields, give needed supervision during construction and finally check the complete terraces to determine that each terrace meets specification and will function properly. The total amount of terraces constructed by the land owner is then certified to A.S.C. committee for payment in case land owner has requested cost share on the practice.

Eastland County has a most favorable A.C.P. program on terrace construction. Payments for terracing is 70% of the cost of construction not to exceed \$5.00 per hundred feet, which is a maximum of \$3.50 per hundred feet Federal cost share.

W. H. Cooper of the Cisco area recently completed one and a half miles of terraces on his cropland. H. A. Sciern of the Carbon area constructed over two miles of terraces on his farm with his own farm equipment. F. S. Crawley, near Staff, built one and a half miles on his farm, and Wayne White in the same area has completed about two miles of terraces on his farms west of Eastland.

Bill Mitcham of Cisco is now building about four and a half miles on his ranch north of Cisco. Roy Adams, west of Cisco, is now building about three miles of terraces, and J. D. Herrell is building about a mile on his farm near Olden.

Howard Wade and Doyle Johnson in the Desdemona area, Roy L. Lane of Eastland, and J. E. Snider each plan to build terraces in the near future.

Farm ponds have been recently staked and constructed, final checks made and certified to A. S. C. Committee for federal cost sharing on the following farms: W. H. Cooper, Bill Wende, C. Y. Owings, E. P. Crawford, R. F. Dolgener, Jr., R. F. Leard, all in the Cisco area, and J. F. Alderman, Geo Webb, Lawrence Collins, and Dean Collins of the Carbon area. W. O. Cantwell, J. T. Robertson, James Kelly, A. E. Crawley, and R. W. Gordon of the Ranger area have also built

ponds. Harold Courtney, L. G. Williamson, Mary Michael, all near Eastland, have recently completed ponds as well as Sam Powers of Desdemona. A number of other ponds are now in process of being built.

Diversion terraces have been built or are in process of construction on W. H. Cooper and Roy Adams of Cisco, J. F. Alderman and Dean Collins of Carbon-Gorman area, Sam Powers and L. W. Riddell of Desdemona, L. G. Williamson of Olden, and F. S. Crawley, near Staff. Diversion terraces are used to divert outside water from cropland, and in some instances to furnish additional watershed to farm ponds.

Land owners are encouraged to apply needed conservation to their land. Those interested in carrying out various conservation practices should contact the County A.S.C. office, the Eastland Soil Conservation Service office, or the local Soil Conservation District Supervisors.

Pecan Growers Win Honors At State Show

Eastland County pecan growers had a number of winners in the annual state pecan show held recently at College Station, according to County Agent J. M. Cooper. There were 172 entries in the state show.

Doss Alexander of Rising Star placed third in showing pecans with the highest percent kernel. His Eastern Schley entry graded 60.3% kernel.

Variety winners from this county were: Stuarts, Mrs. A. L. Ware of Rising Star, first; Western Schley, W. D. Thurman, Cisco, second, and Lee Lieske, Cisco, third; Burketts, Ellis Cooper, Ranger, third; San Saba Improved, W. D. Thurman, Cisco third.

Onliwon, Doss Alexander, Rising Star, first; Squirrel's Delight, W. D. Thurman, Cisco, third; John Garner, Doss Alexander, Rising Star, first, and Lee Lieske, Cisco, second; Best Selling of a named variety, H. L. Capers, Gorman, first.

"We are proud of the winning entries," Mr. Cooper said. "It is only one step forward in helping to develop the pecan industry in the county by recognizing a few of the growers, their varieties and focusing attention upon the crop as a whole and on the county."

Mr. Cooper said the annual Eastland County Pecan Field Day will be held on Friday, April 26, at an orchard to be named later. A committee is at work on the program, he added.

Lake Gains Three Inches As Region Gets Small Rain

Lake Cisco gained three inches of new water and area grain fields got needed moisture as approximately one inch of rain fell in this general region Wednesday. The rainfall measured 1.3 inches at Lake Cisco and 1.0 inch at the city hall.

The rainfall was considerable lighter to the west and northwest and Battle Creek, where the city has a channel dam and pump station to send flood waters to Lake Cisco, did not run.

Pastures and small grains were materially helped by the rain. Farm work was expected to begin in earnest as a result of the new moisture. Nimrod and Scranton, southwest of Cisco, reported nearly one inch of rain.
