War Saving stamps of the 1919 issue should not be affixed to War Saving Certificates of the 1918 series nor should War Saving Stamps of the 1918 issue be affixed to War Saving Certifietaes of the 1919 series. The same Thrift stamps and Thrift cards used during 1918 remain in use and a Thrift Card with sixteen Thrift Stamps thereon, plus 12 cents during January, may be exchanged for a War Savings stamp of the 1919 issue.
