Half Freight Rate On Feed Extended

The half freight rate on feed which was cancelled on last Saturday, has been extended, according to a telegram received from Congressman Blanton and advice received through the Extension Department of the A. & M. Col-

When the railroad administraton announced that the rate would be discontinued on January 25th, the Extension Service immediately took steps to get an extension of the rate, and wired Congressman Blanton to use his efforts to that end. In a telegram to this district received from Mr. Blanton last Saturday, he said that he hal conferred with Traffic Director Chambers of the railroad administration and that Mr. Chambers had agreed to extend the half rate on feed stuffs to the drouth district until March 1st. Daily papers later confirms the extension of the half rate.
