

An et out inleing made in some parts of i xay to get the farmers heavy in feed and food crops. The Ledger has received a letter from t'e Chamber of Commerce in one of the largest Te all ender urging that ve varn the farmer against over production of cotton and under production of teed and food.

The advise may be good, but it does not apply to this "drouthstricken' country. The farmers here will plant both cotton and feed. They must make three crops this year. The letter received by the Ledger says:

If our farmers go ahead and plant a large crop of cotton, we are sure to see very low prices and many business failures will likely follow, no doubt, you are aware of the fact that there is a great deal of cotton from the 1917-18 crop still in hands of the farmers.


