BRITIAN IS PLANING WAR BRIDES SCHOOL

London, Jan. 31. (By Mail) Schools for war brides and soldiers' financees are being planned by the demobilization department.

Domestic science, food chemistry, marketing, and care of childen will be taught.

The government will pay all exenses of the pupil.

The schools will be open only o wives of soldiers and women engaged to marry soldiers. More han 400,000 young women are eligible, it is estimated.

Department officials explain e schools are expected to pay for wives. The schools are needed it is believed, becaus thousands of young girls left their homes to work in munition factories at a time when they ordinarily would have begun to learn household dut

Of 1,500,000 wemen who entered industry during the war, thous ands now are jobless through the closing of munition factories, Hundreds are unable to find other employment because peace industries have not yet got into full swing. The schools are expected to give occupation to hundreds of women who otherwise would have noth-

The wives' and financees' school will be established in scores of cities which because munition centers during the war.




