PERMANENT ARMY TO BE 509'000 MEN

Washington, Feb. 25.—The Senate military affairs committee agreed upon a permanent army recommendation today. The committee will recommend that an army of five hundred and nine thousand men and twenty-eight thousand officers be maintained as a permanent military force for the country.

Company With Franchise Option Wants 30 Days

If the city commission and the land owners agree to an extension of thirty days in which to begin actual drilling the Safety First Oil & Gas Co., of Douglas, Ariz., will carry out the contract recently entered into, provisionally between F. W. Hunter, president of the company, and local parties.

In a letter from Mr. Hunter, received by one of the local interested parties, Monday, Mr. Hunter stated that he returned to Douglas and submitted the Ballinger proposition to his board of directors, and that they enthusiastically endorsed what he had done while in Ballinger, and are anxious to sink a test here, in compliance with the contract Mr. Hunter submitted to the citizens.

The only amendment asked for in the contract is the extension of time for thirty days in which to begin actual drilling. The contract originally called for drilling by June 1st. Mr. Hunter states that his company will begin at once to construct the derrick, and will get ready to drill by the stip-

Confident American People Will Endorse League Nations

NEW NAVAL LAWS WOULD PREVENT WAR

(By Ferguson—Copyright by U. P.)

The revolutionary changes in the International Navy laws, which, fitting in with the rules of the league of nations, would make war virtually impossible, is now under discussion by the war council and peace conference committee.

The regulations under which munitions of war are shipped from neutral to warring countries would be completely overturned. Under the operation of the new rules and laws the freedom of the seas would not be theoretical but real, and battles upon the high seas would be a thing of the past.

Washington, Feb. 25.—President Wilson today stated that he was confident that the American people would rally with practical unanimity to the support of the league of nations.

Mr. Wilson expressed this belief in a telegram he sent to Theodore E. Burton, president of the league of nations union, in New York, in answer to a message he received from Mr. Burton pledging his support.

The president was at his desk shortly after ten o'clock this morning and the sending of a message to Mr. Burton was practically the first work of the day that he attended to.

Washington, Feb. 25.—About the first official act of the President was the signing of the six billion dollar revenue bill which had been passed by congress. Mr. Wilson signed the bill before he retired last night.

THIRD CONTRACT MADE FOR WINTERS

The contract has been drawn, the forfeit put up and the drilling site selected for an oil well on the Jim Johnson land north of Winters, according to reliable information received in Ballinger.

The abstracts to the lands are being perfected and when approved, the work of assembling the material and machinery and actual operation will begin in the usual ninety day period.

This is the third contract closed for drilling in the northern part of the county within the last few weeks, the machinery for the first well now being received and placed on the ground a few miles east of Winters.

According to the information received in Ballinger, the Commonwealth Oil & Refining Company, will sink the well on the Johnson land. Mr. Utterback, representing the company was in Ballinger a few days ago, perfecting the details of the contract.

The Commonwealth is a new company to come in to this part of the state, showing that the interest in the development here is spreading.

Charlie Talyor, of the Valley Creek country, and Bill Grey, of the Crews country, were among the business visitors in Ballinger Monday afternoon.

Troops to Return In Order Divisions Landed In France

Paris, Feb. 25.—Gen. Pershing has issued an order which puts at rest all speculation as to what division of American troops will be returned home first.

According to the general order issued by General Pershing, the American troops will be sent home from France in the order of their arrival at the respective division headquarters in France. This order does not include the regular army divisions, however.

The lack of interest in the present special senatorial election shows the folly of holding same. The law governing in such matters should provide for the appointment by the government in filling such vacancies, and thereby save much money.

OIL GAME SUFFERS FOR LACK OF PUBLICITY

Runnels county is not receiving
the publicity it is entitled to as a
possible oil field. As an evidence
of this fact, few oil men are visit-
ing Ballinger, and the game here
is really a dull one, while the hot-
els at Brady, Coleman, Sweet-
water, Brownwood and other Cen-
tral West Texas towns are con-
ting feeding and sleeping oil men.

As a probable oil field Runnels
county has a superior formation
over any of her neighboring coun-
ties, and the best geologists in the
game have placed their stamp of
approval upon it. Reports from
the best geologists making surveys
in this section of the state do not
hesitate to say that this county,
and the Ballinger territory in par-
ticular, has every structure of a
good oil field.

Yet, Runnels county is tailing be-
hind in the oil game. Even Tom
Green and Coke counties are mak-
ing more tests than Runnels coun-
ty. While only two or three wells
are going down in Runnels coun-
ty, two or three dozen wells are
going down in McCulloch county
and the traffic in leases and roy-
alties in that county is attracting
the attention of the big speculato-
rs.

Runnels county is the only coun-
ty in this section of the field with
an oil well that shot oil above the
derrick, offering the best indica-
tions of a gusher. This fact, cou-
pled with the well known forma-
tion and geologists' reports, should
make Runnels county the best wild

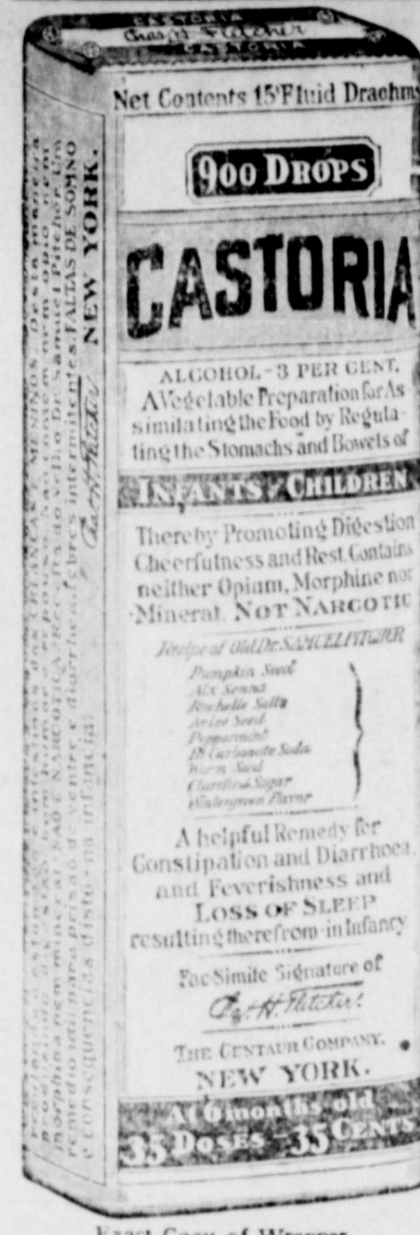

ANGELO TO VOTE HALF MILLION BONDS

According to action of the commissioners court, in passing upon a petition presented to that body by the citizens of San Angelo, last Friday, Tom Green county will go on the road building program with money to protect a system of high ways worth while.

The election to vote \$500,000 worth of road bonds has been set for March 29th. The court not only ordered the election, but passed the following resolution:

"Whereas, on this day the court having passed an order to determine whether or not the county should issue bonds in the sum of \$500,000 for the construction and maintenance of permanent roads, and

"Whereas, if said bonds are issued it will be necessary that the proceeds of the sale of said bonds be expended under the supervision of an engineer; therefore, be it

"Resolved by the commissioners' court that it is the desire of this court that the citizens committee appointed by the board of city development of the city of San Angelo confer and advise with the commissioners' court and assist in finding selecting and employing a capable experienced road builder for an up-to-date and permanent roads and the end that we may be able to secure state and national aid."

The board of city development has already appointed L. L. Farr, R. B. Hall, R. A. Hall and John Y. Rust as members of this committee. The selection of this committee to assist the court assures the tax payers that the half million voted, will be spent properly.

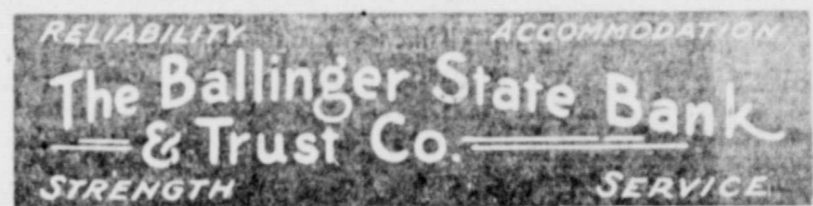
