WATCH YOUR STEP ON YOUR TAX BILL

Washington, March 13,-Watch your step on your income tax! Only a short time remains in which to pay the first instalment.

On Saturday, March 15 returns on all taxes which must be paid by that time are required to be in the hands of the internal revenue collector.

For the purpose of keeping the people informed and to avoid undue delay and confusion, the Bureau of Internal Revenue, has instructed its collectors to warn all taxpayers of the time limit. The first installment must accompany the return on taxes, it was added by the bureau.

1. An amount not less than 14 of the full amount of taxes; 2, an amount not less than 1-4 of the estimated amount of taxes, or payment if this is possible. Tax-

FIVE "Y" MEN GET **CROIX DE GUERRE**

Of Two Latest to Receive Great Honor, One Wounded by Shell.

According to a cablegram from France Henry Wharton of Chestnut Hill, Philadelphia, Pa., the president of a coal company in that city, and Benton V. Johnson, a real estate man of Detroit, Mich., both Y. M. C. A. workers in France, have been decorated with the croix de guerre. General Petain himself presented them. Their decorations increased to five the number of Y. M. C. A. workers receiving the croix de guerre.

Their citations, which were given to them at general headquarters, commended the two for their work under shell fire with the Twenty-sixth division, and especially mentioned their "zeal and devotion in carrying aid to the wounded under a very violent

bembardment."

Both men have followed their division, which has been in the thickest of the fighting, to several fronts. They worked as stretcher bearers in the Toul sector, at Chateau Thierry and in the Argonne woods. While engaged in this work last summer Mr. Johnson was wounded by shell fragments and forced to spend two weeks in the hospital. He re ceived his former citation for h services at this time.
