SEAPLANE NC - 4 **FLIES 4000 MILES** ACROSS THE OCEAN; LANDS IN ENGLAND

London, May 31.-The U. S. N. Seaplane NC-4 left Ferrol, Spain, at 2:27 this morning and arrived at Pylmouth, England, at 9:26 a.m. New York time.

This completes the flight from

New York to England, a distance of over four thousand miles, an average speed of about seventyfive miles per hour.

Out of the four seaplanes which started on the overseas flight the NC-4 was the only one to complete the trip, the other planes having to abandon the flight on account of trouble.


