



By this means, the next generation in France and America would know one another as intimately as they know themselves.

I shall also urge upon the French government the desirability of exchanging professors and students with American universities. I favor the universities of each country adopting one another as sister institutions, so that they shall have a greater sense of comradeship than usually follows the more formal exchange of lee-






