#### FEW OPERATORS STRIKE; REPORTS ARE GONFLICTING

Dallas, June 11.—With a nation wide strike of telegraph operators going into effect at eight o'clock this morning conflicting statements are made and it is impossible to tell the number of operators who are out in Texas. The Western Union Service is declared to be unimpared, while the Postal and McKay services in the principal cities are reported to be badly crippled.

President Konenkamp of the Telegraphers Union, in a statement issued at Chicago, declared that sixty thousand operators struck in the nation this morn-
