Juarez, June 13.-A skirmish occured between federals and advanced forces of General Angeles at 4:30 o'clock this afternoon. Sev eral are reported killed on the fed

El Paso, June 14.-A courier who arrived tonight from the rebel headquarters near Zaragoas, less than 13 miles from Jaurez, reports that the rebels have 4,400 men, all armed with rifles and each man sup Nied with 300 rounds of ammunition.






