# Interned German Fleet Destroyed By Own Crew; Ships Sink With Hun Flags Hoisted

London, June 21 .- "Cerain of the interned German ships at Scapa Flow, Scotland have been sunk by their German Crew.' the British admiralty announces officialy this afternoon.

News dispatches received here state that practically the entire German fleet was sunk, the ships going down with the German flags flying. The fleet was intern ed at Scapa Flow following its surrender under the terms of the




