Eastland County's New Budget Calls For Expense Of \$355,504

missioners Court recently approved a budget of \$156,504.10 for operation of the county for 1957, according to a report here. The new budget puts the county in the big business bracket, making it one of the largest in the

The county will so into the new year with a balance of \$332, 270.08. The estimated expenditures for 1957 are about \$35,452.08 more than the estimated revenue. County Auditor C. H. O'Brien has conservatively estimated revenue, and it is expected that the county will round itself out perfectly as has been the case in recent years.

With 80 per cent tax collection,

n estimates revenue at \$321,052.02, however, records ing the past few years. The tax rate will remain at 80 cents. The rate was increased from 75 cents last year.

The breakdown of funds for the coming year is as follows: 'jury fund, .05; road and bridge fund, .15; general fund, .35; courthouse interest and sinking fund, .15; and road and bridge sinking fund, .10.

O'Brien stated that all funds of the county are in top shape, with the exception of the general fund. The general fund has barely held its own during the past few years, but is due to get relief in 1958 when commissioners can re-allocate funds.

Delinquent taxes as of June 30, 1956, in the county were listed at \$14,443.56 in the budget.

No Acreage Reserve Program

No acreage reserve program will be offered on peanuts for 1957, it was announced Saturday by Emmett E. Powell, county manager of the Agricultural Stabilization and Conservation committee. New payment rates on cotton acreage placed in the Soil Bank Acreage Reserve are due to be mailed to cotton growers in the next few days.

Mr. Powell also stated that land intended to be placed in the Soil Bank Program for 1957 should not be grazed after Jan-Funds for the Conservation

Reserve Program are limited to each county and producers will be signed up on a "first come, first served" basis. No more contracts can be taken when the funds are exhausted, and in no case after March 15, 1957.

Practices of the Acreage Conservation Program for 1957 are seedling pasture grasses, controlling oak and mesquite, con-struction of tanks, diversion terraces, waterways, and standard terraces. Persons interested in carrying out any of these practices were asked to contact the

determined by what is known as the Soil Bank Base for the farm, which is the average acreage planted to Soil Bank Crops on that farm during the years 1955 and 1956, Emmett Powell, County ASC office manager explained. Soil Bank crops are peanuts, cotton, corn, sorghums and small grain for harvest.

All or part of the average acreage planted to one or all of these crops in the years 1955 and 1956 may be placed in the Soil Bank program, it was explained. In other words, a farmer who planted 25 acres of peanuts in 1955 and 20 acres in 1956 is eligible to place a total of 221/2 acres of peanut crop land in the Soil Bank program. If he places all of the eligible peanut acreage in the program he cannot plant peanuts for a period of five years.

Social Security Tax Will Go Up Beginning Jan. 1

Insurance Contributions Act (Social Security) and filing requirements under the Federal Unemployment Tax Act have been changed by recent amendments to the law, according to A. E. Fogle, Jr., Administrative Officer of the Abilene office.

New F.I.C.A. rates on wages paid on or after January 1 ,1957 will be 2-14 percent each for employers and employees, a total of 4-1/2 percent, Mr. Fogle said. The changes in the Federal Unemployment Tax Act, he explained, provides that employers who had four or more employees on at least one day of each of 20 calendar weeks during 1956 will be required to file Form 940 by January 31, 1957. The filing of Form 940, Annual Federal Tax

had eight or more employees. Mr. Fogle said that copies of this return have been sent to most of the employers in this district. However, he suggested that employers who have not received this form by January 9, obtain copies from the local Revenue office at Abilene.



Curried Rice and Tuna Make a Tasty and Thrifty Filling for Luscious Tomatoes

Rice brings together the deep Oriental excitement of curry in this versatile main dish. The curry powder contributes exotic hanced by the bits of green pep-per and the brilliant red of the

INGREDIENTS: 8 medium sized ripe tomatoes 4 tablespoons minced onion 2 tablespoons minced green

pepper i tablespoons butter or margarine

1, 7-ounce can tuna fish
2 cups cooked rice
1 teaspoon curry powder
1/4 teaspoon salt
1/4 teaspoon pepper
1/2 cup water
PREPARING THE FLUFFY
WHITE RICE: To make 3 liberal curs of fluffy rice, out 1 cup eral cups of fluffy rice, put 1 cup of uncooked rice, 2 cups of cold water and 1 teaspoon of salt into 2 quart saucepan and bring to vigorous boil. Turn the heat as lew as possible. Cover saucepan with a lid and leave over this

low heat for 14 minutes. Do not remove lid nor stir rice while it is cooking. Turn off the heat. Use exact measurements of un-cooked rice and water. Time the

cooking accurately.
For real convenience and econ-way of time and effort, keep unused rice in the refrigerator in a covered container at all times. Use it for many quick, delicious and inexpensive soups, salads, casserole dishes, hot breads and desserts.

METHOD: Peel tomatoes easily by scalding, plunging into cold water and then peeling. Slice off stem end of tomatoes. Carefully scoop out pulp. Cook onion and green pepper in the butter or margarine until-tender. Add the tuna fish, rice, curry powder. salt, pepper and water. Mix thoroughly. Fill the tomatoes with the tuna and rice mixture and bake at 350° F. about 15 minutes or until the tomatoes are tender. Serve hot. Garnish with green pepper rings if desired.

For a cool and refreshing salad, chill the tomatoes after they are stuffed and serve on salad greens.

This recipe makes 8 servings or 3 cups of the curried tuna

Continued from first page The same holds true for corn, cotton, sorghums and grain for harvesting. If he places only a portion of the two-year average crop acreage in the program he can plant the remaining acreage to the particular crop affected. The following additional regu-

lations governing the program were outlined by the ASC office: "The acreage placed in the Conservation Reserve Acreage program must have a cover of perennial grass established as

"The Soil Bank Program will share 80% of the cost of establishing this grass cover.

"The Conservation Reserve Acreage must not be pastured nor have a crop harvested from it during the time of the contract.

"In addition to the cost-sharing on the cover crop, the Soil Bank program will pay a rental of nine dollars (\$9.00) per acre, per year, during the contract period, if no crop is grazed or harvested.

"The producer must control the growth of sunflowers and cockleburs on the Conservation Re-

"A producer may put acreage in the Conservation program and still place cotton, peanuts and wheat in the Acreage Reserve Program.

"The land in the acreage reserve must be defined in the contract and can not be moved from field to field.

"If the producer violates the contract during the five (5) years, he will repay all the money received under the contract with interest at 6%. In addition to losing all the payments on the farm, the producer is subject to a penalty of 50% of the annual payment.

The contract can not be terminated until the end of five (5)

"If a producer sells or loses control of the farm during the contract period and his successor does not wish to continue the contract the original producer must refund all the money received.

"Producers who sign Conservation Reserve Acreage contracts must plant within the allotted crop acreages except wheat, which has a limit of 15 acres or the allotment whichever is the

"The entire acreage on farms under contract will be checked and measured for compliance and the total Soil Bank acreage crops must not exceed the permitted base.

"Landlord and tenant must both understand and sign the acreage agreement.

"In case of a cash lease, the lease must be at least for the duration of the contract.

"A landlord must not reduce the number of tenants in order to increase his share of the Soil Bank payments."

Contracts are now being signed in the program and farmers and landowners interested were advised to contact the County ASC office for further details.
