MEXICO ACGUSED OF OVERT ACTS

Weshington, July, 2.-Urgent representations have been made to the Mexican Government for the punishment of those responsible for the murder of John Corrall. an American citizen, the malterat ment of his wife, and the attempted murder of his son, at their ranch near Colonia, twenty-seven miles north of Tampico, the state department announced today. Instructions have been sent to both the American embassy at Mexico City and the American consulate at Tampico to urge immediate capture and punishment of the gu lty persons, and protection fo other Americans in the dis-

Six days after the attack on the Corrall family the paymaster of the Gulf Refining Co., an American concern, was robbed of \$5,000 gold which he was taking to the oil fields from Tampico. The pay master, it was learned, had notfied the Mexican authorities at Tampico, as required by law, of the date and time of his departure, the amount of money he was taking . and the route he would use in reaching the oil fields. The territory through which he passed is entirely controlled by Carranza




