### PRO AMENDMENT FINALLY PASSED

Austin, July 18 .- The Senate today finally passed the bill putting into effect the amendment for state-wide prohibition. The vote was ninteen to seven, showing that only a small number of the senators voted. The bill now goes to the house.

### Yanks Won in This Contest

Paris, (By Mail).-Just who won the war is still a live question of debate, but there is argument as to which notion's warriors came off best in matrimonial contests in France. The Yanks won.




