Washington, Aug. 13.—President Wilson will veto the law proposing the repeal of the daylight saving act, it was said today 'The measure has been before the President since August 5th and he is expected to return it to Congress before the end of the week. Efforts to pass the agricultural bill, with repeal rider, over President's veto failed last month and both the House and Senate leaders doubt that a two thirds majority necessary to pass the repeal law over the executive's head can be obtained.


