Mrs. Baugh had not given the board a definite answer Saturday, but will no doubt come to the rescue of the situation.

Miss Martin, of Gainesville, has accepted a place in the primary school, and will teach first and second grades in the Central Ward building. Miss Martin has been teaching at Sterling City.


