

Washington, Sept. 20 .- When normal conditions are restored, purchasers of high priced land may find that they are unable to make profitable returns on their investments.

This is the conclusion of the Bureau of Farm Management of the Department of Agriculture. after an investigation of speculation in farm lands. Prices of farm land in some sections have risen so rapidly that serious consequences may be expected, the bureau believes.

High prices for crops have been reflected in the prices paid for land and speculators, many of them not farmers, have grown rich in buying and selling at high fig-

Farmers have sold their land at what seemed good prices, but have been compelled to buy again, losing thousands of dollars in the exchange. This may cause embarassment said the bureau, if the purchase is financed on credit.
