Bank at Ballinger, writes that he had just returned from Corpus Christi, where he went to look after his sister and her family who were in the storm. Mr. Homann states that his sister, her husband and two children were washed across the bay to White Point in the awful storm, and had a miraculous escape. They suffered almost death, his sister being badly lacerated and lost much blood She is in the hospital and Mr. Homann recovered the children and carried them home with him.

A dozen men and a couple of dozen ladies met at the Queen Theatre Wednesday afternoon in response to a call for a mass meeting to discuss plans for preventing an epidemic of influenza here. The crowd was not a large one, but those present were in earnest about the work, and will attempt to interest others in taking a hand in precautionary measures to be inaugu-

Mayor Guin presided and the question of a general clean-up campaign for this city, the campaign to be launched at once, was discussed at length. Plans suggested by the state health authorities will be carried out as far as

It was decided that the city be cut up into districts and a committee appointed in each district to assist in enforcing the clean-up rules and sanitary ordinances. It will be the duty of this committee to report to the city a uthorities parties who violate the sanitary rules and who refuse to clean up their premises.

The city authorities will instruct the city marshall to get busy and see that the sanitary laws are enforced, and every citizen is urged to cooperate in carrying out the work.

At the meeting Wednesday afternoon most of the school teachers were present and sanitary rules will be taught in the school and an effort made to educate the people along lines that will help to make for good health.

We are now in the flu season, and no time should be lost to put into effect every rule which will help to keep down disease. Report to the city health officer, Dr. E. R. Walker, contagious diseases, and cases where people are not complying with sanitary


