Huge Telescope Is About Ready

Most Powerful Instrument in World to Give Man Better Look Into Universe.

PASADENA, CALIF. — The most powerful telescope in the world, designed to give man his farthest and most comprehensive look into the universe, should be ready for its first test next summer, said Dr. John A. Anderson.

The telescope with its 200-inch mirror is expected to permit astronomers to "see" twice as far into space as they do now with a 100-inch telescope.

To Bring Moon Closer. The instrument will enlarge eight times as much space, and reflect four times the amount of light.

It should bring the moon within an arm's length of earth, astronomically speaking.

It may lead to discovery of new planets and stars.

The optical range of this telescope, according to theory, should be about one billion light years. A light year is the distance light travels, at 186,000 miles a second, in a year.

This new range should enable astronomers to make a more accurate estimation of what goes on in the universe of this vast length.

The project, financed by Rockefeller foundation, includes work here and at Mt. Palomar 125 miles to the southwest.

At Pasadena, an optical shop, where the 200-inch disc and auxiliary mirrors are being ground, will receive the other buildings at Pasadena are the astrophysics instrument shop, where instruments, precision machine parts and optical mechanisms are manufactured, and the astrophysical laboratory, which houses offices, research facilities and a solar tower.

Many Engaged on Work. The observatory site at Palomar has an altitude of 5,550 feet. In addition to three telescope buildings at the site, other buildings providing for the director, assistants, shop facilities, gas, offices and storage have been constructed.

The new community on Mt. Palomar also includes resident cottages, lodging accommodations, dining hall, water pumping plant and a school house. These have been used by the approximately 10 persons engaged in constructing the buildings.

When the big mirror is completed here, it will be transported to Palomar for a test mounting period, which may be one week or two or three months, depending on results of tests and difficulties encountered.

A small, 12-inch mirror is being prepared for test with the observatory equipment in case there is more delay in completion of the big mirror.

Observation at Palomar is expected to be much clearer than is now possible at Mt. Wilson, where observation difficulties have increased because of the growth of the Los Angeles area with its industrial smoke and general city haze.

Cable Under Highway Will Provide Power for Motors

LONDON.—Start of construction on "the world's first high frequency motor road"—on which cars drawing current from a cable under the concrete can run 125 miles an hour—was reported from Moscow by Tass.

The Russian news agency said the idea was conceived by Prof. Georgi Babat, Stalin prize winner, and that construction would cost less than that of a trolley line.

This is how the road works, Tass said: "A cable charged with high frequency electric current, resembling an ordinary motor road, will generate an electromagnetic field within a range of 10 to 13 feet.

"Motor cars will be equipped with special receivers of high frequency current, which will pass into an ordinary motor installed on the car."

Youngster Picks the Right Chaser After Aspirin Binge

CLINTON, N. J.—Rollin F. Mitchell, 24, consumed 30 aspirin tablets in a bout of cough medicine and a bottle of cod liver oil from the family medicine chest.

He topped his feast off with an appropriate chaser—a bottle of castor oil.

Doctors said his condition was satisfactory.

New Yorkers Gladly Pay for Fresh Air

Inticcate Ventilator Eliminates Poison in Tunnels.

NEW YORK. — Adding "inflation" notes: Fresh air is being cheerfully bought and paid for by some 97,000 people every day in this haven of city slickers.

These folks are not being gypped, however, for otherwise they would be overcome by carbon monoxide poisoning.

These facts were disclosed in an inspection report by Harrison Wood, New York district manager of SKF Industries, Inc., on the intricate ventilation systems that keep the city's streets and Queens-Midtown tunnels and George Washington bridge approaches free from motor exhaust gases left by thick traffic between Manhattan, New Jersey and Long Island.

The cost of keeping the fresh air part of the toll paid by the 97,000 motorists passing daily through these three major traffic arteries.

Ventilation of Lincoln tunnel, 100 feet below the Hudson river, requires 36 fan stages revolving on engineered spherical roller bearings to minimize chances of a breakdown at operating speeds necessary during rush-hour traffic, Wood said.

Up to three million cubic feet of fresh air per minute is circulated through the tunnel.

Installed in 1937 under supervision of Chas. W. Muck, mechanical engineer for the Port of New York authority, the huge blowers are housed in special concrete structures at each tunnel end.

Operating 24 hours a day, they have never broken down since they went into operation nine years ago, Wood pointed out.

Fresh air moves so rapidly through the tunnel that if it could be channeled into a 10-foot square duct, running from New York to Albany, it would arrive in the state capital 10 minutes after leaving this city, it was pointed out.

Twenty men working in three shifts stand guard around the clock over a battery of carbon monoxide analyzing instruments which register the amount of gas that is constantly collecting in Lincoln tunnel.

Fan speed is regulated according to varying traffic volumes and, although the water, power, machine oil and maintenance costs are high, air is considered safe, tunnel authorities think the count down to only two parts a double precaution.

Says Chemistry May Solve Food Problem

BOSTON. — A prediction that the world some day may feed its starving by use of radiation chemistry was made by Dr. Charles F. Kettering, chief scientist of General Motors corporation, at the convention of the American Association for the Advancement of Science.

Radiation chemistry, also known as photosynthesis, he said, the method nature uses, to make the earth's present food supply out of carbon dioxide of the air, and water, and a few minerals.

"We know little of the process now," he declared, "but some day we may be able to reproduce it in the laboratory."

He said radiation chemistry is the secret of photography, but that its principles are used only to a small extent in industry.

New Compact Atom-Smasher Is Developed by Scientists

PHILADELPHIA. — Development of a new, compact atom-smasher, which produces a beam of 70,000-volt X-rays and produces construction of energy-producing machines many times more powerful for atomic study was revealed here.

Dr. Herbert C. Pollock, leader of a group of scientists which constructed the device, said in a lecture at Franklin Institute that it was built as part of a project sponsored by the office of naval research at the General Electric research laboratory, Schenectady, N. Y.

The new device, named the synchrotron, indicates the possibility of producing radiations of much higher energies for atomic study with greater economy than with earlier equipment, Dr. Pollock said.

Alexander Is Selected as Chief of Britain's Defense

LONDON. — A. V. Alexander, former chief of staff of the defense ministry, assumed the post of prime minister, following royal approval of legislation creating the new cabinet post which is responsible for coordinating army, navy and air forces. The defense title hitherto has been held by the prime minister.

LESSON FOR MARCH 16

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INTIMATE FELLOWSHIP WITH CHRIST
 LEXION TEXT—John 14:14, 18-19; MEMORY SELECTION—Ye are my friends if ye do whatsoever I command you—John 15:14.

The hour had come for our Lord's final intimate words with his disciples. It was indeed a solemn, but also a blessed, hour.

It was the night before the darkest day in the world's history. On the cross the Son of man was to hang on Calvary's tree for the sins of the world—for your sins and for mine. But for the moment he was alone with his disciples.

The last Passover had been eaten together, the betrayer had been discovered, and the Lord has told them that he was soon to go where they could not follow. Peter had, by his bold self-assurance, brought forth the prophecy of his denial. The disciples were disturbed in heart and mind. Then came from the Saviour's lips the words of comfort, assurance and power, which have been the strength and solace of his people through all the centuries. Our life both here and hereafter is in his mighty hands.

We learn in this precious portion of Scripture that:

I. The Christian Need Not Be Fearful (14:1-6).

That is indeed a good word—a needed word! Troubled hearts are everywhere—in the palace and in the cottage, on land, in the air and on the sea. There is a place of rest, thank God! There is One who still speaks the majestic words, "Let not your heart be troubled, believe in God, believe also in me."

His comfort is one which covers the future life, for he says, "I go to prepare a place for you. Concern about future destiny is settled at once when Christ Jesus becomes our Lord and Saviour. We need worry no longer, for he has gone on before to the Father's house to prepare a place for us. When we come to that peaceful shore, we shall not come as strangers, but as sons and daughters to a prepared place in our Father's house. His words, "I will come again" (v. 3), gives present meaning to the future promise. He not only prepared the place, but he is who brings it there. The glowing hope of his coming again is the Christian's greatest comfort and mightiest incentive to useful, holy living.

II. The Christian Need Not Be Powerless (14:12-15).

Christ's followers are not here in a world of sin and need as a little group of hymn-singing weaklings, thinking only of the day when they shall be in a brighter land. Ah, yes, they sing hymns and rejoice in them; they look for a better life; their weapons of warfare are not carnal. But weaklings? Oh, no! God uses them to do great and mighty things for his glory.

Note the blessed words of Jesus. "He that believeth on me" (v. 12). The army of God carries the royal banner of faith in a living Christ. "Greater works shall he do" (v. 13). Jesus only began his work on earth; his greatest development was to be the joyous privilege of his followers. We are ashamed that we have not lived up to this great promise, but by his grace we will do better.

"If ye ask . . . I will do" (v. 14). Someone has called this a signed blank check on all the resources of God.

III. The Christian Need Not Be Distressed (14:18-19).

The Holy Spirit, promised by Christ as the abiding comforter, came so to abide in the believer on the day of Pentecost (Acts 2).

The ministries of the Holy Spirit are many, but here the emphasis is on his work as Comforter. What a blessed and helpful ministry, and how much needed by distressed and disturbed souls! The Christian may count on him—and not be distressed.

IV. The Christian Need Not Be Detached (15:1-5).

What is worse than the feeling that one does not belong to anything else, that one is a detached individual? That is never true of the believer in Christ. We are as close to him as the branch to the vine. We are in him.

Christ is the vine, and the believer as a true branch is united with him. There is a oneness here which is difficult to express, but delightful to receive and believe. He

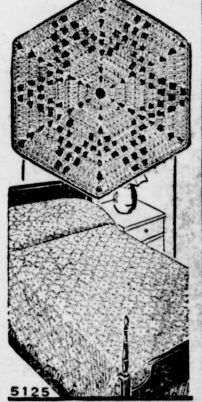
The foreman believed in getting the workers to cooperate with him. In an effort to inspire them to an even greater output, he called them together for a talk.
